Economic Justice

Living Wage (HB 727): Gradually raises the minimum wage, with future increases tied to cost of living.

Tax Fairness (HB 231): Increases tax credits for food, rent, and impoverished families.

Reigning in Real Estate Investment Trusts (HB 1064): Taxes REITS, which are owned by nonresidents.

Safe Sidewalks (HB 236): Establishes a safe sidewalks progam for Wahiawā to enhance pedestrian safety.

Subminimum Wage (HB 232): Eliminates the subminimum wage for workers with disabilities.

Educational Opportunity

Education Funding (HB 1285): Generates \$500 million more per year for public schools.

Schools Our Keiki Deserve Act (HB 723): Establishes a student-centered focus on whole child learning.

Career and Technical Education (HB 724): Expands vocational education opportunities in public schools...

Teacher Tax Credit (HB 726): Provides a tax credit to teachers for classroom supplies and materials.

Civic Education (HB 1063): Expands instruction in civic engagement and democracy in public schools...

Standardized Testing (HB 725): Reduces standardized testing to the minimum amount required by law.

Aloha 'Aina

ADC Audit (HB 1066): Requires an audit of ADC and that ADC invest in local food production.

Carbon tax (HB 1287): Creates a carbon fee to fund renewable energy infrastructure, education, and jobs.

Pesticide Abuse (HB 1065): Expedites investigations of pesticide abuse that result in illness or injury.

Community Food Forests (HB 237): Creates a food forest program for low-income communities.

Mauna Kea (HB 1067): Prohibits further development of the Mauna Kea summit.

Health and Human Rights

Drug Treatment (HB 235): Increases funding for rehabilitative drug treatment services.

Homeless Mental Health Services (HB 234): Provides funding for mental health services for the homeless.

Sex Trafficking (HB 233): Raises penalties for perpetrators of commercial sexual exploitation.

Single-Payer Healthcare (HB 1287): Establishes a universal healthcare coverage system for Hawai'i.
